What is the ambulatory care unit?

The ambulatory care clinic is a nurse-led service providing the following treatments for patients within the Queensway Day Hospital. The service covers:

- Care of central venous lines
- Intravenous drug administration
- Sub cutaneous injections such as Clexane for DVT pathway
- Complex wound dressings
- Catheter care / changes
- Urinary catheter care /changes
- Intravenous therapies including seven day antibiotics
- Vacuum assisted wound closure therapy (KCI & Talley)
- Provision of ankle brachial pressure index (ABPI) measurement service (This measurement only service will not be available at Yeovil until early 2016)

Patients attending the clinic for treatment must bring with them on the day:

- Any dressings they require
- Any medications required for administration
- If medications are to be administered, the patient will need to bring with them a fully completed prescription chart (MARS) duly signed by the GP or nurse prescriber in Primary Care

When is the service available

Monday to Sunday 9am to 4pm (including bank holidays) by booked appointment only.

The service is available seven days a week – ongoing treatment if appropriate may be provided at the weekends.
